Endeavour Community Hub

Now Open on Calvert Road, Great Lever

Last month, Avery and other IVH volunteers rolled up their sleeves to help with the finishing touches ahead of the launch of an exciting new community partnership in Bolton.

We're leasing one of our homes in Calvert Road, Great Lever, to the Endeavor domestic abuse charity.

The new partnership will allow them to create the 'Endeavor Community Hub' from the premises expanding their counselling service and increasing the group work they offer around empowerment, confidence building and coping mechanisms.

Jill Caldwell, Chief Executive of Endeavor, said: "We hope to develop the hub to have something to offer for everyone. Having a base within the heart of the community gives us and other agencies the chance to develop new services and work collaboratively for the benefit of everyone."
