This month Irwell Valley Homes celebrates its 50th birthday – marking five decades since we were formed with just a handful of homes in Salford. Over the years many things have changed and we have grown a lot – including taking over the Sale West estate from Manchester City Council in 2000.

But the reason we're here remains the same – to provide safe, affordable homes and to make a difference in the communities we serve. A big part of this is making sure neighbourhoods are good places to live. At the start of the regeneration works, residents told us they wanted more play areas across the estate and we are delighted to have delivered these.

What better way to celebrate our birthday than opening these new play spaces and inviting you to join us for a community play date!

Friday 26th May 2023 from 3.30pm-5.30pm.

We'll be officially opening the new natural play areas and will have ice creams, balloons, games and a whole load of fun for all the family!

We'll also be launching a half-term scavenger hunt across the estate for the children to complete during the holidays, with a hamper of treats up for grabs as the prize.

Improving existing homes

We're pleased that 233 homes now have new kitchens as we continue to make good progress with our kitchen replacement programme.

Work is currently underway in homes on Newbury Avenue and Thirsk Avenue following work on Ascot, Aintree, Goodwood, Kempton and Catterick Avenues last year.

We've received some great feedback from happy customers who are enjoying their new kitchens.

We have also replaced fencing across the estate and fitted a total of 510 new roofs to homes and 97 new roofs to apartment blocks since we began work on the estate.



Enhancing the local environment

Over the last 12 months we have been working to enhance the estate environment using the £975,000 grant from the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities which was awarded to Trafford Council to support our regeneration works. The funding was granted on the basis it would be spent on projects that enhance the local area.

Works completed so far include:

- Four new natural play areas, with equipment and features which promote balance skills and encourage creative play. Two are located at different points on Chepstow Avenue, another on Haydock Avenue (you can see it from Firs Way) and the final on the footpath running behind Epsom and Hurst Avenues.
- New homes for wildlife including swift bricks and boxes; a bug hotel and bat boxes.
- 270 trees planted across the estate. We're delighted that some of these have been dedicated to members of the Sale West community past and present.
- Finger signposts to make it easier to find the way around the estate on foot.
- Horticulture projects with Brentwood School and St Margaret Ward School sharing new skills with the next generation.

- Improvements to Sale West Allotment replacing raised beds and making the area more accessible to all.
- Resurfacing work to ginnels across the estate where surface water and flooding were a problem.
- Two new community areas created with customers offering a place where residents and neighbours can enjoy time together outdoors.
- Landscaping, planting and new benches which are due to be installed next month.



Sale West resident Caitlin said her six-year-old daughter Mila was enjoying having one of the new play areas on her doorstep.

"It's a real hit!" she said.

"The kids have been on it non-stop since it opened. It's somewhere safe they can play and great there are some new things to do out there. Even something as simple as the new path has gone down well – they can go up and down on their roller skates or bikes. She and her friends love it.

"It's a great addition to the estate and hopefully we'll get some nice weather over the summer so they can continue to enjoy it."





The next phase begins...

The work on Sale West is ongoing and the regeneration programme is divided into different phases.

The new family homes for social rent as part of the first phase of work are due to complete this year. Our contractor Seddon is currently working with the utility companies to divert services so that construction work on phase 2 can begin.

Phase 2 involves building 22 one and two-bedroom apartments and two-bedroom houses, including several ground floor accessible homes for those with mobility needs. These homes are in short supply in Trafford and we want to do something about this.

In preparation for it, we held a 'Meet the contractor' event back in January. Louise and Jenni from our development team also went door to door visiting those directly impacted by the work - explaining our plans and gathering feedback to reduce the impact on existing residents as much as possible.

We have brought together some of the common themes in the FAQs below.

Q: Can I rent one of the new build homes?

A: The new build homes will be advertised and let via Housing Options Service Trafford (HOST). This is the way we let all out homes as it ensures they go to those most in need. If you are interested in renting one of the new homes, please register with them. More information is here www.traffordhomechoice. co.uk/choice/default.aspx

Q: How will car parking be affected?

A: Although there will be some change to your usual parking routine whilst the work takes place, the car parks will be improved through this work.

This includes levelling the surfaces and renewing the white lines to make a better use of the space in the long term. Some of the areas will end up with more parking than they currently have once the building work is finished.

Q: How will you ensure bins are emptied whilst work is being carried out?

A: We know this did cause issues during the first phase of works so we have established links with Trafford Council's Refuse Collection Service (run by Amey) and will work hard to prevent any issues with bin collections. The Seddon site team will also schedule deliveries outside of bin collection times to reduce the chance of difficulties.

Q: What about the noise?

A: Seddon are a member of the Considerate Constructors Scheme – as such work in the early morning or late at night will only be in exceptional circumstances.

Q: What about the impact on traffic, particularly around the schools during drop-off and collection times?

A: We are working with St Margaret Ward Primary School, Brentwood College and Trafford Council to explore crossing solutions for Cherry Lane to encourage parents to park in other areas. Seddon are also aware of the impact of the school traffic so will avoid the school run period.

"After being homeless for 15 years, I still have to pinch myself that we're here"

A mum-of-two who had been without a home of her own for 15 years feels like she has 'won the lottery' after moving into one of the new homes on the estate.

Michelle* had been forced to move into her mother's house following the breakdown of a relationship but had remained trapped there by rising private sector rents, huge deposit requirements and a shortage of affordable rent homes.

With her two children getting older, the situation was having a huge impact on their lives.

"We were running out of space," she said.

"We were desperate in the end and it was really impacting on our mental health, particularly my teenage son.

"He had a tiny box room and my youngest shared a bedroom with me. There was no space of our own to relax in. It was really tough and it went on for so long for everyone – including my mum, who really deserved her home back."

But now Michelle is over the moon to have started a fresh chapter in a home of their own on Sale West – with a bedroom each and a garden to play in.

"When we came to see it we just burst into tears!" she said. "We couldn't believe this was going to be our home.

"It's made such a difference already – my sons are so happy to have their own room and place they can make their own, and I'm loving having free rein in the kitchen! The boys are even joining in, learning to cook and trying new things which is fantastic. The garden will be brilliant over the summer.

"We're over the moon to be here after so long cramped at my mum's. It's only been a few weeks but even now I think back and I don't know how we did it. Everything is so different now. I feel secure and happy – it's our home and I'm looking forward to making lots of happy memories in it."
